

Event Descriptions

Poker Run:

A fun event with separately marked courses for rider levels from beginners to experts. The event is not a race but enables individual riders as well as families of all experience levels the opportunity to enter an organized event.

24 Hour Marathon:

A race - fun - social event - that is open to teams of riders to ride Marathon and Novice Courses.

The team in each class or the ironman rider that completes the most laps in the twenty-four period determines the winner.

The challenge is not only against the other teams and individuals but against the clock, as well as the terrain and fatigue.

Make sure that your team pre-registers right away, as this incredible event is limited to 200 teams.

Hare Scramble:

A closed course event of approximately 30km's to 50km's where riders race for two to three hours. These events generally consist of a mix of tight single track, double track and may include sections similar to a motorcross track.

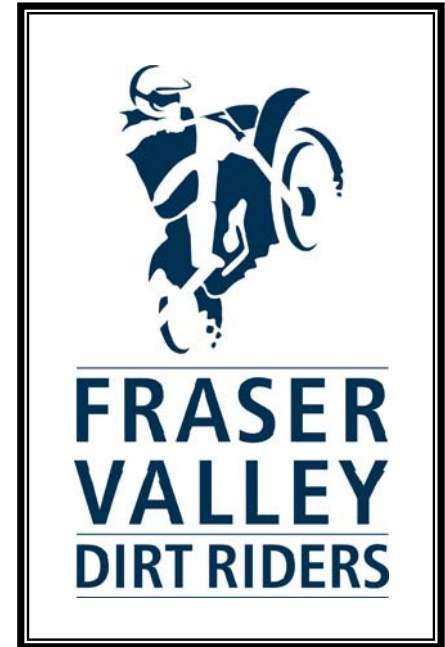
